Pregnancy Crisis Centers and Maternity Homes may...

- Offer free pregnancy tests
- Provide a 24-hour emergency hotline
- Provide housing
- Give ongoing support and friendship
- Help arrange for good medical care
- Offer prenatal & postnatal guidance
- Furnish maternity clothes and baby needs
- Provide adoption information
- Help with planning for the mother and baby's future
- Sponsor a support group
- Provide birth control counseling



The people who provide help at pregnancy crisis centers and maternity homes are volunteers and staff from all walks of life, working quietly to offer pregnant women a chance to give birth with dignity and pride.

They are people who care. They know that they are providing services for women facing perhaps the greatest personal crisis in their lives. And they are there to help.

GUIDELINES

- Criteria for the baby items:
 1. Preferably handmade**
 2. Preferably new**
 3. Preferably washable
 4. Smoke-free & pet-hair-free
- Ideas
 1. Softer yarns and fabrics are more comfortable
 2. Label items that contain wool
 3. Recycle clean towels by using them to make bibs and burping pads
